Kerry was inspired by recent sightings of a greater spotted woodpecker at the RSPB Headquarters in Bedfordshire. Based within a nature reserve known as 'The Lodge', this special location is situated in woodland, heath and grassland along the Greensand Ridge and is



a favourite destination of many rare birds each season. About the size of a blackbird with striking red and monochrome plumage, the bird has a very distinctive song and a bouncing flight but spends most of its time clinging to tree trunks. Kerry adds a spectacular image of the woodpecker taking flight, revealing a fan of wonderful white and black-flecked feathers as it does so.


Moonlit Badgers
